## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

## Registration

Registration for all summer programs opens Monday, April 18, 2022, and closes Friday, May 6, 2022 at 4:30 p.m. Parents/Guardians will receive communication from their school to register by paper copy. Paper copies of registration will be sent home with students and will be available in each school office.

Late registration will be open May 16, 2022 and will close May 27, 2022. Late registration will be accepted as spaces are available in the chosen program.

#### <u>Price</u>

All programs are free of charge for students of Eufaula City Schools.

## **Transportation**

Transportation will be provided to students.

Parents/Guardians can indicate on the registration form if transportation is needed.

## <u>Meals</u>

Students will be provided with breakfast and lunch each day at no charge.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

## **Eligibility**

Programs are available to students in Eufaula City Schools only. Students who are not enrolled in Eufaula City Schools will not be eligible to participate, with the exception of drivers ed.

- √ Kinder Camp is open to incoming Kindergartners.
- ✓ Summer Scholars is open to students who have been retained or need credit recovery. Students who are eligible will be contacted by their school.
- ✓ Summer Start is open to students who are are below grade level or missing certain skills. Students who are eligible will be contacted by their school.
- ✓ Summer Sensation and Tigers Inspired are open to all students.

#### Attendance

Students are expected to attend each day of the summer session for which they are enrolled. Sessions will run Monday-Thursday.

## <u>Discipline</u>

Students will follow the discipline policy in the Eufaula City Schools Code of Conduct.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

## Medical Information

A nurse will be on site for each day students are on campus during the summer. Students who have daily medicine needs will need to register their medicine with the nurse, just as they do during the regular school year.

## **ARCH Counseling Services**

# Kinder Camp

Target Students: Incoming Kindergartners for the 2022-23 school year

Dates: July 11-21 (Monday-Thursday) Location: Eufaula Elementary School

Time: 8:00-2:00

Kinder Camp is a two week program designed for incoming Kindergarten students. The purpose of this program is to orient students to Eufaula Primary School and general Kindergarten procedures.

Students will be placed with their 2022-23 Kindergarten teacher to foster relationships early on. The teacher will work on procedures, navigating the school, and completing the AlaKids assessment that is required by the Alabama State Department of Education.

Students will learn the above skills through developmental play, role plays, songs, games, read alouds, and arts and crafts.

Targeted Students: Students who have been retained in grades 3-5

SUMMER SCHOLARS

This program is designed for students who have been retained in Reading and/or Math for the 2021-22 school year. Students will receive focused, explicit instruction from a certified teacher with an emphasis placed on the critical standards for their grade level.

Students who show mastery in the critical standards with a passing score of 60% will be eligible for promotion.

Students will also receive explicit instruction in Reading using Reading Horizons.

Students will be assessed on the critical standards as they are taught throughout the session. At the end of the Summer Start session, students will take the NWEA Map test as a means of measuring growth over the summer.



# SUMMER SCHOLARS Grades 6-12

Targeted Students: Students who have been retained in grades 6-8 and students who have failed a credit in grades 9-12



This program is designed for students who have been retained or who have failed to receive a credit. Students will participate in credit recovery classes through Edgenuity. A certified teacher for each content area will be available for small group learning and support.

Students who show mastery in the credit recovery course with a passing score of 60% will be eligible for promotion.

## SUMMER START Grades K-5

Targeted Students: Students who are behind in Reading and/or Math and have completed grades K-5

Grades K-5

Dates: June 13-July 21 (Monday-Thursday)

Time: 8:00-2:00

Location: Eufaula Elementary

This program is designed for students who are below grade level in Reading and/or Math. Students will receive instruction that is targeted to their need.

Students will receive explicit reading instruction daily using Reading Horizons and small group. Students will also receive enrichment opportunities with a STEM focus.

At the end of the Summer Scholars session, students will take the NWEA Map test as a means of measuring growth over the summer.

Dates: June 13-July 21 (Monday-Thursday)



Grades 9-12


