- Discuss and review the compact at each parent/teacher conference either face to face or virtually

Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.

- Provide information about the student's progress and school activities through weekly newsletters, bulletins, school website and progress reports every 4.5 week and 9 weeks.

Provide parents reasonable access to staff.
